All entries must be made via the British Rowing Online Entry System (BROE) (http://www.britishrowing.org/).

Each competitor or crew shall have a named Manager/Coach.

The Coach must be over 18, named on the entry form and a current mobile phone number must be provided. (This information will be kept securely by the Hon. Secretary for Entries, but will be readily available if it becomes necessary to contact the Coach urgently).

2. The Draw

The draw will be published 7 days before the event.

Publish date: 16th May 2025 at 18:00. After which point British Rowing Rules apply.

3. Payment

Entry Fee

Payment must be made by the closing date.

All Entries must be paid for via BROE2.

If an event is cancelled the Committee will endeavour to refund up to 50% of the Entry Fee.



4. Events:

<u>Note</u> that the Committee reserves the right to change the format of the progression based on the number of entries, the weather, and competency of the age group.

4.6 Right to Refuse Entry

- 4.6.1 It is the Coach's responsibility to ensure race entry rules are followed.
- 4.6.2 The Committee reserves the right to withdraw a crew at any time. Failure to adhere to race entry rules will result in disqualification from the event.
- 4.6.3 Crews can be withdrawn after The Draw or during racing should it be found that the rules have not been adhered to.

5 Eligibility

5.1 SCHOOLS:

- 5.1.0 Only bona fide members of a School Rowing Club are eligible to compete for that school.
- 5.1.1 Competitors must be Under 19 on the day of competition.
- 5.1.2 Competitors who attend schools with rowing clubs must compete for their school. Exceptions will only be granted if the School Principal or Head Teacher provides a signed and headed letter granting permission.

5.2 ROWING CLUBS:

- 5.2.0 Competitors who do not attend schools that row may compete for a Rowing Club provided:
- 5.2.1 They are Under 19 on the day of competition whilst still in genuine secondary education, or
- 5.2.2 They qualify under the BR Junior category, whether in secondary education or not.

5.3. REQUIREMENTS:

- 5.3.1 The School or Rowing Club competitors will represent the place where they have been a member since the 1st October previous to the regatta.
- 5.3.2 This School or Rowing Club will be the place where the competitor carries out their usual day-to-day training.

5.4. RESTRICTIONS:

- 5.41. Composite crews are not permitted in any events.
- 5.42. Entries for crews will not be accepted from a non-school Rowing Club unless the membership of such club is open to all young people wishing to learn to row or scull.

5.5. QUERIES:

5.5.1 Any queries over eligibility for any event should be addressed to the Hon. Secretary for Entries (entries@nationalschoolsregatta.co.uk) in writing prior to the entry being made. The National Schools' Regatta Committee will subsequently decide if the entry is acceptable.



6. Conditions of Entry

- 6.1. Coxes are the only competitors permitted to double-up.
- 6.2. No competitor may compete for more than one School or Rowing Club during the entire regatta.
- 6.3. Each competitor must be entered for the event designated by age group or above.
- 6.4. Competitors below J14 age (coxes below J13) will not be accepted.
- 6.5. Competitors of J14 age will not be accepted in sweep-oared events (BR rule 2-3c)
- 6.6. Crews entered for 3rd 8+, must NOT contain more than 3 J16's (excluding cox).
- 6.7. A club may not enter a crew for a Second Event unless it has entered one crew for the First Event for the same age category. For Third Crews, an entry will need to be made in the First and Second event.
- 6.8. Race Event Restrictions: Note that the number of crews you are allowed to enter is now restricted as outlined in tables under section 4 "Max No of Entries".

7. Watermanship

- 7.1 In the interest of safety, Coaches are requested **not to** enter crews whose ability to cope with the Dorney Lake rough conditions and the 2000m distance is suspect. If crews are not sufficiently skilled to compete, the club/school may be sanctioned the following year.
- 7.2 The NSR Committee reserves the right to cancel an event; or withdraw crews from the Regatta who, due to lack of watermanship, may endanger the safety of themselves or of other crews, or disrupt or delay the Regatta.
- 7.3 Crews must be taught how to keep their boat straight on the start, when there is a side wind blowing. This is achieved by either Bow or 2 sculling with a blade parallel to the boat

8. Boats and Equipment

Each crew shall provide its own boat.

The Committee cannot make allowances for boat sharing in the timetable.

Each boat shall be fitted with an Empacher slot for a lane number, without which a crew may not start. Attention is drawn to BR Rules of Racing: Coaches must ensure that boats are properly checked prior to being taken to the rafts.



9. Prizes

Medals will be presented to the first three crews in all events provided that at least one other crew starts. In order to medal, you have to beat a crew. Winners will be required to sign a receipt for any trophy taken away, to insure it, and to return it in good repair having been engraved.

<u>Note</u> that in the event of further racing being cancelled due to weather conditions after the Time Trials or heats have been conducted, prizes may be awarded to the crews with fastest recorded times. Therefore crews are advised to aim for their best possible time rather than a time that may be sufficient to qualify.

12. Withdrawal

Any competitors who fail to appear for their races will be required to pay a penalty equal to the entry fee. They or their Club may be debarred from other events in the regatta as a consequence.

If the penalty is not paid, no entries will be accepted from that school or club in the following year.

Withdrawal will be allowed without penalty if notice is given to the Hon. Sec. for Entries and there are acceptable reasons.
