



# National Schools' Regatta 2021 - Changes

## Introduction

After an extensive period of consultation the National Schools' Committee is delighted to announce the 2021 NSR Race Event structure.

The National Schools' Regatta is proud to be the UK's premiere rowing event for juniors in the UK and Ireland and we want to ensure this continues. The design of this new race format has incorporated feedback from extensive discussions with coaches from clubs and schools across the country. We would like to thank everyone who has engaged so positively in the process. We believe the format will enable NSR to continue to deliver a world class event for every competitor, coach and spectator.

We recognise the events offered do impact on how schools and clubs organise their teams over the year, we hope the balance of events on each day will give racing opportunity to the youngest whilst also offering performance progression. Friday remains dedicated to our youngest and first time competitors, with the Junior 14 and 15 crews racing. Saturday and Sunday will continue as a two day Championship Regatta for the Junior 16 to Junior 18 elite level competitors.

We remain committed to offering events for Second crews, staying true to our founder, Desmond Hill OBE's wishes to organise a regatta *'to provide wider experience and competition for juniors in school.'*

However due to the annual growth in race entries and the need to organise a safe regatta there will be NO DOUBLING UP. We believe more juniors will have the opportunity to race in different boat types and we hope NSR will continue to provide clubs and schools with the opportunity to showcase the racing performances of more junior rowers.

In 2021 we will run a similar progression system with time-trials for all events. For those crews that qualify for side-by-side racing they will be offered at least one race, with most getting two races.

We wish you every success with your training and racing over the coming 7 months and we look forward to welcoming you to Dorney Lake in May 2021.



# National Schools' Regatta 2021 - Changes

## Our Strategy

The driver for the change was both a need to address the regatta management due to the ever increasing entry numbers and a desire to reflect the needs of clubs and schools.

- Gender parity of events. The time has come to offer the same number of events for boys and girls. We also wanted to bring the rules for events to parity.
- Alignment between the number of sculling and rowing events offered. To reflect the distribution of our entries we have added sculling events.
- Increase racing opportunity. No doubling up.
- Balance the number of crews racing each day
- Continue to offer a world class racing experience - Reduce the hours of racing on Saturday and Sunday to ensure event management remains first class.
- To simplify the rules and qualification for each event.

Entries in 2019 were close to parity.

- Boys - 647 (55.5%)
- Girls - 518 (44.5%)

NSR also has more sculling entries than rowing ones (even if you remove the J14 8x+).

- Sweep - 421 (J16 and up – 304) (36.1%)
- Sculling - 744 (J16 and up – 430) (66.4%)

NSR has an almost equal number of schools and clubs entering the regatta. It is also worth noting that compared to boys, the junior girls tend to row in smaller numbers at more clubs, resulting in more girls racing in small boat types.

25 Hours of racing over 3 days.

## Some Rules:

1. Time Trials for each event.
2. No doubling up (except J15s who row in the 4x on Friday may compete in the VIII's on Saturday)
3. To enter a 2nd event you must have a crew in the Championship tier of the same event.
4. To enter 3rd Vllls you must have a crew in both Championship and 2nd VIII's.
5. Only 1 entry per Championship event. Except Ch1x where 2 entries are permitted.
6. No more than 2 crews in any 2nd event.
